God in His incredible mercy decided He would bless us. Two days into no hot water they finished early and turned the gas

back on for us – truly a miracle here in Slovakia. Your prayers mean so much! The next blessing came with our landlords deciding to put A/C in our apartment – installed a week later and fully paid for by them! God was not done, our friend and our landlord both came to help us start the car, and the dead battery came back to life! We are blessed in so many ways!
